





- 1. Assemble the dice. I usually print, laminate, cut, score/fold on the lines, and then use clear tape to keep them together. Laminating seems to keep them from getting destroyed. You can glue as well. If you've never assembled a die before, then just Google it. It's easy.
- 2. Print and copy the graphing sheet.
- 3. I usually have this activity as a center for my EFL students, but you can structure it however you'd like. You can use it for math, vocabulary building, your theme, etc. It works well as a partner activity or a small group of around 4. Decide how to use it based on your own class.
- 4. Students take turns rolling the two dice. They color in a square for each picture that comes up. (i.e. Adam rolls "turkey" and "pumpkin pie", so he colors in two squares on his graph. One for turkey and one for pumpkin pie.) Pretty self-explanatory.
- 5. You can structure it to have students play for certain amount of time or until one reaches 10 on a row.





